

### THE HASCOMBE ALMANAC 1873

Parochial Statistics for this year reported: "Some expense has been necessary in providing a new boiler for the warming of the church, amounting in all to £10 4s 6d, (equivalent to £1558 in today's money) Churchwardens take this opportunity of appealing to such of the Parishioners as are able to increase the amount of their voluntary rate this year, to some degree, to meet this outlay" The Offertory collections for the previous year amounted to £22.12s.9p of this sum £19.11s.0p was distributed in 146 different gifts among 32 families in age, sick or want leaving a balance in the Rector's hands of £3.1s.9p" Care and attention of the Churchyard "Some tiny specimens have been planted of the huge Wellingtonia pine<sup>1</sup> which reaches in its native climate a height of 360 feet; should ours in future times attain even half this growth, they will become landmarks in the country. The yews at the main entrance of the churchyard are intended someday to form a natural lich gate<sup>2</sup>. In old times it was very common to have at the churchyard gate a large open porch called a "lich gate" under which the bearers rested the bodies of the dead, as they were borne to their last home. This month's "Rules of Health" encourage us to: "Live modestly, exercise freely, bathe daily, rise early, dress lightly, take things coolly, eschew wine and strong drink, shun doctors and drugs, lawyers and lawsuits, marry a good wife, and endeavour to make her happy"
